
# How to Separate Laundry? Here is What Expert Says



Everybody is there. Your best-fitting pants and your favourite white T-shirt are in the laundry hamper, but you still want to wear them. You figure that throwing them in the washer together won't hurt, at least not this time. Did your T-shirt turn out looking a little dirty, or worse, like blue tie-dye? ## **How to Separate Laundry?**

#1 - Check The Care Label:



Read the care label first, especially if you've never done laundry before or have <u>new clothes</u> to wash. Selecting the appropriate water temperature, washing machine cycle (use the mild cycle if the label suggests hand washing), and drying temperature is made easier by the label. <u>Dry clean only</u> clothing that requires special care should always be kept apart from washable products.

#### #2 - Sort The Clothes According To Colour:

Sort the remaining laundry by colour after setting aside the items that should only be dry cleaned. Light grey, pastel, and white clothing are stacked together. Dark clothes, such as scarlet, black, brown, dark grey, and navy, belong in a separate pile.

#### #3 - Sort By Type Of Fabric:



Sort every pile by fabric type one last time. Keep delicate <u>lingerie</u> or lightweight synthetic materials away from cotton T-shirts and jeans. Before putting delicate items in the washing machine, they can be put in a <u>mesh laundry bag</u>. To cut down on lint and pilling, separate cotton towels that produce lint from blankets and microfiber sportswear.

#### #4 - Arrange Particular Dirty Stuff:

Make a last sort if you have any really filthy goods. Lightly dirty clothing shouldn't be washed alongside muddy children's clothes or oily work clothes. On other textiles, the soil may be re-deposit.

Separating laundry by colour, fabric type, and soil level is key to keeping clothes fresh and long-lasting.
