#1 - Use Vacuum:

Not only is your vacuum used to remove particles and dust from the interior of your house, but You can also use it to get rid of soot.

Use some sodium bicarbonate on the affected area and rub it in before attempting to remove the soot from your clothes with a vacuum.

Attach a nozzle to your vacuum after that is finished. Turn on the Hoover when you're ready. The stain would be sucked out of the garments by the machine.

Set the clothes in the washing machine and proceed with the recommended cycle.

#2 - Soak It:



Putting the clothes under cold water is one method for getting rid of soot marks. Make sure the clothing is inside out before proceeding.

Don't rub the fabric or do anything similar while the cool water is passing through it. You run the danger of spreading the stain to other areas of the garment if you handle it frequently.

It's best to let the water take its natural course.

#3 - Use Baking Soda:



Baking soda is the one stain remover that you should always keep on hand. It's important to have this available at all times. It's never too late to use it!

Baking soda can be used to help remove difficult soot stains from clothes. It's incredibly easy to use.

To remove soot stains from clothes, sprinkle some baking soda over the affected area. Give the baking soda a half-hour to sit. You can easily shake or brush the baking soda off after letting it soak into the stain. Baking soda can help in removing the soot's hold on the fabric. The soot peels off when you shake it off.
